

Finding and Booking Space for Meetings

CITY HALL

Booking of space by not-for-profit organizations, for municipal-related business, is given priority. Weekday bookings are available only after 5pm (regular City Hall business hours). Weekend bookings are also available.

Be aware that Mayor Watson announced on January 23, 2013, that each City Councillor will be able to book Jean Pigott Place (the large, open space beside the Council Chamber) once a year, at no charge, for use by a not-for-profit or community group in their ward.

OTTAWA PUBLIC LIBRARY

Many branches have meeting rooms (including auditoriums) that may be rented at reasonable prices by Not-for-Profit organizations, such as Community Associations. If your City Councillor or any City staff member is involved in the meeting, the space is free of charge (although will need to be booked through the Councillor's or City Staff office).

Library meeting spaces are listed here by location, with their room capacity, price, and contact information. There is no "central booking". Bookings must be made through the branch, where you would like to meet.

LIBRARY & ARCHIVES CANADA

The auditorium and two conference rooms are available for rent to not-for-profit organizations whose mandate falls within the mandate of LAC. For Community Associations, the relevant clause within LAC's mandate reads, "Facilitate in Canada cooperation among communities involved in the acquisition, preservation and diffusion of knowledge."

CITY CHURCHES, SYNAGOGUES, MOSQUES

Most local religious buildings have meeting spaces for rent. Many will ask you to purchase Liability Insurance for your meeting or event.

OTTAWA SCHOOL BOARDS

Ottawa Carleton District School Board

Ottawa Catholic School Board

The OCSB provides no-cost use of schools to all not-for-profit community groups, provided a caretaker is already on duty (ie. weekday evenings). Algonquin College of Applied Arts & Technology

Meeting room rentals are available, to accommodate groups from 15-900 people. Choose from classroom facilities (equipped with a data projector, computer, telephone, and Internet access) or from rooms that can be reconfigured to accommodate your needs. They also have computer labs, auditorium style classrooms with desks, and boardrooms.

The Department of Physical Recreation and Athletics rents out several of its facilities, to the public, for tournaments, club events, and social activities.

Halls, meeting rooms, banquet halls (80 to 256 people), auditoriums (100 to 420 people), cafeteria (600 people), suitable for workshops, receptions, club meetings, conferences. Audio-visual facilities available.

OTTAWA CITIZEN

The conference facility is available for use by not-for-profit organizations, subject to availability and cancellation on short notice. Use is limited to once a month per group. Tables and chairs are available. Group must provide audio-visual and/or other equipment and supplies. Capacity: 135 people (standing room only), 80 people with chairs only, 55 people utilizing tables and chairs.
