June 15, 2017-- For immediate Release: The Federation of Citizen's Associations of Ottawa (FCA) is pleased to announce its lineup for its 30th annual General Meeting. The Meeting will take place **June 15th**, **7:15 p.m. at City Hall in the Colonel By room.**

The FCA has gone through a transformative year with many groups from around the city participating in civic activities ranging from planning to safety and security, transportation, environmental causes and many more. The FCA acts as a bridge connecting both community and City Hall to enable more community engagement in civic issues. Guest speakers from all levels of government including councillors and top level city staff are regularly invited to the FCA's general meetings.

This year's AGM will feature guest keynote speaker Marc Denhez, a lawyer and former member of the Ontario Municipal Board (OMB), who will be providing an allocution titled: *Fixing the planning system*.

The FCA-FAC is the forum for citizens associations and similar non-profit volunteer groups in Ottawa, Canada. It does not endorse parties or candidates seeking office. The FCA is an incorporated non-profit corporation under Ontario law and, as such, can appear in its own right before the Ontario Municipal Board.

The FCA membership includes associations from the city center, the inner suburbs, the suburban communities outside the Greenbelt and rural Ottawa. The membership of the FCA is not comprehensive — there are established community groups which are not yet members of the FCA. Nevertheless the FCA strives to communicate with all identifiable community groups.
