# Agenda item 7: Committee reports Planning & Zoning Committee

#### **Development Charges**

Documentation for the revision of development charges is expected to be released by monthend. Although there have been extensive discussion with the development industry, community groups have been invited to a single briefing only. The general meeting will be asked to approve an FCA statement **requesting that greater community involvement be secured in future** discussions of Development Charges.

#### Official Plan stakeholders meetings

FCA has been asked to provide representatives to participate in stakeholder meetings to occur from April through June on the Official Plan. The meetings will take place during working hours and three panels will discuss (1) Growth Management (incl. projections), (2) Intensification strategies, and (3) Validation of selection criteria for expansion lands (if urban expansion is found necessary). We are asked to nominate as many as nine people to participate; **volunteers are needed**. #### Urban boundary appeals

Although discussion about a new Official Plan has begun, a few challenges to earlier OP's continue. The general meeting will be asked to approve FCA joining in a **call for the remaining appeals of the urban boundary to be dismissed by LPAT**. In justifying dismissal two arguments are: (1) studies related to the old OP are now out-of-date and new studies are about to begin, and (2) Council did not consider urban boundary expansion at all so there is no decision to appeal.

### **Transporation Committee**

#### Municipal Parking

The committee has actively participated in meeting about revising the Municipal Parking Management Strategy (See <a href="https://ottawa.ca/en/city-hall/public-engagement/projects/municipal-parking-management-strategy-mpms-refresh">https://ottawa.ca/en/city-hall/public-engagement/projects/municipal-parking-management-strategy-mpms-refresh</a>). The general meeting is asked to **approve two FCA comments** on the objectives of the revision of the strategy: (1) to support a re-written objective which specifies encouragement of sustainable transportation and, (2) to restore to the objectives of the strategy the possibility of funds derived from municipal parking to be used to
