Agenda item 10 – Transportation Committee

Following its meeting of April 17, motions from the Committee: Motion #1:

That the FCA recommend that Ottawa City Council <u>defer</u> the Project Prioritization Framework in order to permit more extensive public consultation on the factors to evaluate the priority of transit and road projects, including climate change, accessibility, safety, and equity/inclusivity; to examine the partition of capital funds between transit and road projects in the Framework; and to report back to City Transportation Committee in June 2023.

Motion #2:

Whereas the FCA recognizes the importance of the City's Transportation Master Plan on the quality of life of residents in Ottawa as well as meeting their transportation needs;

Therefore the FCA strongly supports Action 4.2-C of the TMP: "Report to Council regularly on the state of the transportation system in Ottawa and progress toward the objectives of the Official Plan and TMP." and urges Council to have these reports be made annually and publicly. Further, the FCA recommends that there be public consultation on the metrics involved in developing these reports.

Agenda item 12 – Other Business – Support for Community Care Sector

Motion re. FCA Letter of support for the Community Care Sector

Whereas the community support sector provides services and programs to enable isolated seniors and people with disabilities to live independently, through providing such supports as meals on wheels, adult day programs, respite care, transportation to medical appointments, etc., through local non-profit agencies; Whereas provincial funding for this sector has not kept up with inflation since 2012, despite the growing need for such services;

Whereas the recent provincial budget contained no increase in funding to this sector, forcing these agencies to begin implementing cuts in service to their clients beginning this April:

Therefore the FCA Board recommends that:

the FCA write to the Minister of Health & Long Term Care (copying Ottawa-area MPPs) to express its concerns over the lack of sustainable funding to enable community care agencies to continue to serve isolated seniors and persons with disabilities living in our communities, and urge the Ontario Government to take the necessary steps to ensure both present and future needs of these vulnerable persons are met so that they can continue to live independently in our communities.
